With wound care taking up an increasing amount of GPNs' time — the Burden of Wounds study highlighted how they are key players in leg ulcer management (Guest et al, 2015) but time pressures making training opportunities less available, being able to learn in your own time is becoming

Periwound skin

In some cases, findings of assessment of the wound edges can also reveal the aetiology of the wound (Milne, 2017b), e.g. vascular and venous ulcers have a demarcated edge, but vascular ulcers have steep sides while venous ulcers have stoped sides (Grey et al, 2006).

Remember: overlooking assessment of the skin can result in trauma and pain for the patient and lead to deterioration and extension of the wound (Mudge et al, 2008).
